

**HB 1077: HEALTHY FOOD FINANCING PROGRAM
2015 ANNUAL FUNDING RESOURCES**

Farmer's Market Promotion Program (FMPP)

Increases domestic consumption of, and access to, locally and regionally produced agricultural products.

Award Amount: up to \$100,000

Local Food Promotion Program (LFPP)

Supports the development and expansion of local and regional food business enterprises to increase domestic consumption of, and access to, locally and regionally produced agricultural products, and to develop new market opportunities for farm and ranch operations serving local markets.

Award Amount: up to \$100,000 with 25% matching

Federal State Marketing Improvement Program (FSMIP)

Assists in exploration of new market opportunities for U.S. food and agricultural products, and to encourage research and innovation aimed at improving the efficiency and performance of the marketing system.

Award Amount: Average \$67,000 / \$1 to \$1 match

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Farmers Market Support Grants (FMSSG)

The new funds assist grantees by connecting low-income families with fresh, healthy, local food options by expanding SNAP use at these markets.

Award Amount: up to \$250,000 / matching funds not required

Community Food Projects (CFP)

Community Food Projects are designed to increase food security in communities by bringing the whole food system together to assess strengths, establish linkages, and create systems that improve the self-reliance of community members over their food needs.

Award Amount: up to \$300,000

Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentives Program (FINI)

Supports projects by increasing the purchase of fruits and vegetables among low-income consumers participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

Award Amount: (1) FINI Pilot Projects (up to \$100,000 over one year)

Community Facilities (CF)

Supports rural communities by providing loans and grants for the construction, acquisition, or renovation of community facilities or for the purchase of equipment for community facilities.

Award Amount: Varies by project, applicant's financial feasibility, and community size

Reinvestment Fund's ReFresh Initiative

Designed to improve the access of healthy foods in urban and rural communities across the U.S. where long-standing barriers exist, making it difficult for residents to live healthier, more stable lives.

Award Amount: Varies by project, applicant's financial feasibility, and community size

Robert Wood Johnson Foundation

Helps Americans lead healthier lives and get the care they need by reflecting that mission of private resources that must be used in the public's interest."

Award Amount: Varies by project, applicant's financial feasibility, and community size

Economic Development Assistance Program (EDAP)

Provides economically distressed communities and regions with comprehensive and flexible resources to address a wide variety of economic needs, and are designed to lead to the creation and retention of jobs and increased private investment.

Award Amount: Varies by project, applicant's financial feasibility, and community size

Safeway Foundation/CHRCO Program

Develops interdisciplinary, and collaborative community and/or clinic-based programs designed to reduce the burden of childhood obesity. Interest areas include targeted collaborative programs that increase children's physical activity, improve food choices and/or create better access to healthy foods.

Award Amount: \$40,000-\$75,000

Accelerating Food Hub Development Grant Program

The objective of the Food Hub Development Grant program is to build food hub's capacity to overcome current challenges and position them for long-term success. Capital can finance simple equipment needs (e.g. trucks, packing lines, walk-in coolers), as well as system needs (e.g. product-tracking software, staff training, and basic business systems) that can improve hub operations and help refine and/or scale the operation and improve financial viability. Coupled with capital, the Wallace Center will offer intensive capacity building and technical assistance that will benefit not only hubs but also the farms they source from.

Award Amount: \$10,000-\$75,000

Partners for Places

Partners for Places creates opportunities for cities and counties in the United States and Canada to improve communities by building partnerships between local government sustainability offices and place-based foundations. National funders invest in local projects to promote a healthy environment, a strong economy, and well-being of all residents. Through these projects, Partners for Places fosters long-term relationships that make our urban areas more prosperous, livable, and vibrant.

Award Amount: \$25,000 - \$75,000 / \$1 to \$1 match

Healthy Food Access Portal

Designed to help people access resources related to healthy food access policy efforts, funding opportunities, and successful retail strategies. Our three organizations selected resources and created content that would appeal to users from diverse backgrounds - community leaders, entrepreneurs, government officials, public health advocates, and economic development practitioners. In so doing, we aim to build and strengthen a community of learning and practice.

Award Amount: Varies by project, applicant's financial feasibility, and community size
