Challenge overview

Inspired by a group of students at Warren High School who decided to take a stand against youth violence and start a movement called We LIVE Indy, the Indy Youth Empowerment Challenge brings together existing conversations across Indianapolis and a diverse set of voices to co-create solutions that empower youth.

Using a people-centered approach, the Indy Youth Empowerment Challenge will move through a four-month innovation process:

- INQUIRE (February): Understanding the barriers and catalysts to youth empowerment
- IDEATE (March): Brainstorming ideas
- INVESTIGATE (April): Turning ideas into solutions
- IMPACT (May): Preparing for implementation

Participation will take place Online and through community and youth-led workshops. While a diversity of voices will be leveraged, the youth voice will be amplified throughout the challenge. For more information, visit: communityINNOVATE.org

The Ideate Phase toolkit

The Ideate Phase toolkit is the second of 4 toolkits for the Youth Empowerment Challenge. Each toolkit is set up in a style to easily guide you through all the steps you'll need to complete in order to participate in each phase of the 2018 challenge.

What you will need for this phase:

- Downloaded ideate phase toolkit
- · Access to a printer
- Printer paper or cardstock
- Access to the INTERNET (to upload your ideas)
- Color pens or Markers
- Scissors
- Post-its
- A timer
- A camera

The Goal of the Ideate Phase toolkit

To generate ideas that potentially solve each Challenge Statement around the issue of youth empowerment.

Getting Started

To get started using this toolkit, follow along and complete the tasks below:

Print out this complete toolkit
Cut out the Prompt Cards

Things to Remember

- *We are in the IDEATE phase, so be sure to come up with as many ideas as possible.
- * You can play this game in a group or individually
- * You don't have to do all 4 Challenge Sheets, work with the ones that you feel more passionate about
- * Write one statement per post-it/index card
- * Complete a Good Idea sheet (This is what will be posted Online)

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Rules of Play

Before playing this game, be sure to have all your elements ready to go (cards, post-its, markers, prints, etc.). *It is very important to make sure you create a safe space for everyone to contribute while they are participating.*

Contents

- 1. Prompt Cards (7)
- 2. Challenge Statement Sheets (4)
- 3. Good Idea Sheet (Print as many as needed)

Object

- To generate ideas for empowering youth
- Facilitate conversation among diverse groups
- Write as many ideas as possible. There are NO WRONG ANSWERS
- This game has a time limit! Just stay focused with your group members and move to the next **Challenge Statement** within the given time.

Set Up

- 1. Print and Cut out the 7 Prompt Cards (page 9)
- 2. Set out all 4 Challenge Statement Sheets (page 5-8)
- 3. Give all participants post-its and a marker.
- 4. Shuffle Prompt cards and set around the Challenge Statement Sheet.

What Happens in a Round

There are 4 Challenge Statements Sheets. During one round you will:

- · Create a pool of ideas for the Challenge Statement
- Choose an idea or set of ideas that you think would work well together, and describe in detail using the *Good Idea Sheet* (page 10).

Step 1 - Generating Ideas (5-10 mins)

- 1. As a group, decide which *Challenge Statement* you're most interested in/excited about, and start with that one.
- 2. Use the prompt cards as inspiration to come up with ideas.

2 Ways to Play:

- Face Up: around the Challenge Statement for everyone to see.
- Face Down: reveal one at a time for inspiration as needed.

- 3. Write each idea you have for the challenge statement on a separate post-it and place it around the *Challenge Statement Sheet.*
- 4. SAY YOUR IDEA OUT LOUD as you place it

on the sheet to inspire the group.

5.After 5-10 minutes of generating ideas, move on to Making Good Ideas.

TIPS FOR IDEAS

- It's OK if your idea is similar to another idea in wording or concept.
- No need to think of "how it would work"
- When in doubt, just write it down
- No need to take turns when placing/announcing ideas

Step 2 - Making Good Ideas (10-20 mins)

- 1. Take a moment to look over the pool of ideas you generated as a group.
- 2. Individually, choose an idea or set of ideas that you want to see happen to describe in detail. You can also work in pairs, or small groups to describe your idea.
- Create a *Title* for your idea, *Check* the box of the challenge your idea belongs, write and/or draw a description of the *Good Idea*, and write the *Good Reasons* why you think this is a good idea. You can do more than one if you have time.
- 4. Have the group share their Good Ideas along with the Good Reasons
- 5. After everyone in the group has shared their Good Ideas **take a picture and upload** them to the *Ideate* section of **communityinnovate.org**
- 6. Start a new round with a different *Challenge Statement Sheet*; Get through as many Challenge Statements as you can.

TIPS FOR SUBMITTING

- Make sure all Good Idea sheets are facing the same direction
- Make sure the photo isn't too blurry to read
- Take your picture as close up as possible without cutting off any words or images on the **Good Idea** sheets

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Step 3 - Close up/Feedback (5 min)

Before disbanding the participants, please use the prompts and Online tool to give us some valuable feedback on your experience.

- 1 Place the Feedback sheet in the center of a table.
- 2 Ask each participant to connect to the Online feedback tool via their smart phone or some other device that they can access the INTERNET from.
- 3 Allow time for each person to respond to the feedback prompts through the Online tool.
- 4 Thank you to you and your participants for taking part in the CommunityINNOVATE 2018 challenge.



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
